

OCTOBER 8, AT PEN PARK PAVILIONS 1 & 2 NEAR THE PARKING LOT


Blessing of the Animals starts at 4:30pm and is open to the public. Invite your animal loving friends to bring their caged or leashed pet to

and Blessings mission here at CFUMC is providing a meal on Mondays for the people in our community that need food. (It is another way we Love the Whole City) We are glad to be able to provide this support for the people in the community that need help, but it is sad that the number of people needing this support is increasing. I would like to thank all those that help this mission by volunteering their time to help cook and serve the meals and provide hand baked cookies to hand out.

The number of guests that we serve has dramatically increased in the past few months. A year ago, we served 60-80 meals on Mondays. Now we are serving up to 150 meals. We see many people that are new to this area that we've never seen before. Some of these new folks started coming when the WIC program returned to pre-Covid levels. By the end of the month there is no money for food unless they dip into their rent money. We see a lot of the traditional homeless. Some are drug users, alcoholics and the mentally ill or disabled. We are not in this ministry to judge - just to provide a meal, with a side of love and prayers.

Obviously, as the numbers increase so does the amount of food we prepare. Providing more meals means more money needed to buy the food, as well as more people needed to prepare and serve the meal. Our church provides the volunteers for the 2nd, 3rd and alternating 5th Mondays. There is a desperate need for more volunteers, especially from 11:45 – 12:45 to serve the meal. We assemble the meals inside the church and hand out them out along with the drinks from a gate that we open near the playground. None of the guests enter the church property.

I take pride in the fact that our church provides a nutritious and generous midday meal. This is a meal I would gladly serve my own family and guests. Surprisingly, the cost of individual servings of crunchies/sweets is a fairly large proportion of the cost of the meal. We currently buy individual prepackaged portions to supplement the homemade cookies our volunteers provide. Please note that donations (store bought or homemade) are always welcome!

If you would like to support this mission of CFUMC, there are several ways to help:

- volunteer to serve or cook on Mondays
- ♦ donate cookies or snacks
- ♦ donate money to the church, (put Bread and Blessings in the memo line)
- ♦ keep the homeless and those in need of a meal in your prayers.
